Item:	Responsibility
<p>1. Welcome and approval of agenda</p> <p>LT welcomed students Charlotte Crockett Jørgensen (ENG) and temporary member Christine Ingerslev (TECH) to the Study Environment Group and noted there is no staff member from ENG and no student member from HUM. Christine Ingerslev will represent TECH until her expected graduation in the summer.</p> <p>The agenda was approved.</p>	
<p>2. The Study Environment Day</p> <p>This year's Study Environment Day will take place on 15 March. This year it will be a campus-specific event, while the official university-event will be held the week after in Aalborg.</p> <p>This year's theme is the psycho-social study environment from the students' perspective. The group agreed that less time should be spent in plenary and more in work groups to allow more students to contribute.</p> <p>The group discussed various ways of interpreting the psycho-social study environment in terms of accessibility, student representation and diversity, e.g. in terms of access for wheelchairs, study counselling, a student political organisation and furniture/inviting surroundings for breaks.</p> <p>There is a strong need for better feed-back to students regarding various initiatives, especially regarding student-initiated projects, but also regarding the work on study boards etc. That is a responsibility both of the university administration and the various study boards.</p> <p>More must be done to educate the students about how to establish (and get funding for) student organisation, as the number of organisations and active students is still very low considering more than 3000 students on campus.</p> <p>The group discussed how much a vibrant study environment is actually demanded by the student body as a whole. The group identified bachelor's students and international master's students as the most crucial – and probably easiest – students to focus on and activate.</p>	
<p>3. Looking forward: this year's work in the Study Environment Group</p> <p>The results of the Study Environment Day will frame the group's work for the rest of the year.</p>	



<p>The group discussed the fact that very few master's thesis students have access to study spaces specifically allocated to them. This is foremost a departmental matter, but the group discussed various ways of alleviating this challenge, either by prompting programmes to assign such facilities, or by transforming unused seminar rooms to shared spaces for thesis students across programmes.</p> <p>The group also decided to investigate ways of promoting knowledge-sharing about study environment ideas between programmes.</p>	
<p>4. Other business</p> <p>A question was raised whether it is possible to turn on the water in the bicycle repair corner when the temperature is high enough in the winter months.</p> <p>Also mentioned was a request to make the slides from the information screens available online. Shared Services CPH will look into both requests as well as continuing the efforts to disseminate knowledge about what's going on at campus.</p> <p>Christine Ingerslev was selected to represent the students in the university's Study Environment Council, while Charlotte Crockett Jørgensen will take over for the fall semester.</p>	<p>Shared Services CPH</p>
